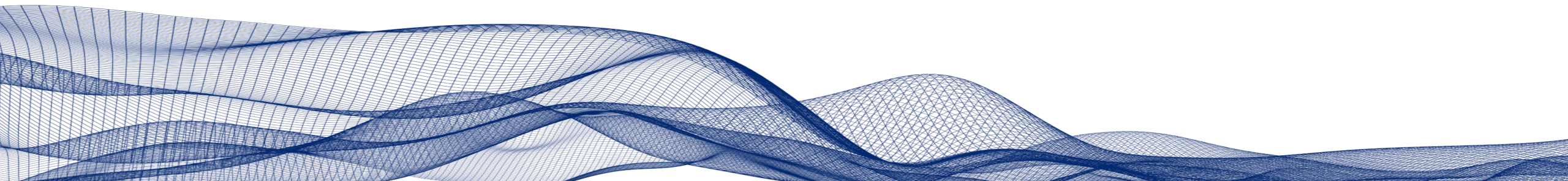

GERAD Follow-up on Research Dissemination and Open Access

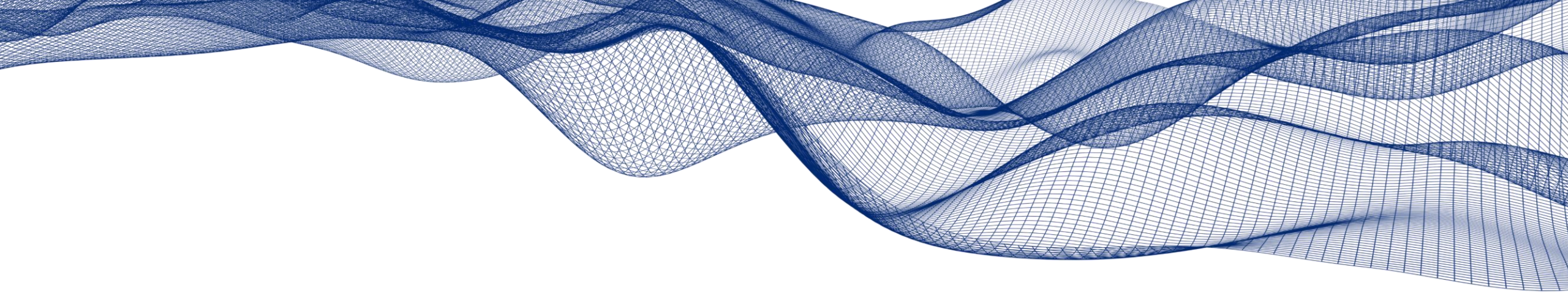
- Training sessions/meetings on open access and tools offered by university libraries (McGill, Poly, UQAM, HEC).
- Dissemination of GERAD Working Papers on ResearchGate (65 articles, 3407 reads, 33 recommendations, visibility in research tools).
- Considerations for making research more accessible by email (before, during and after publication).



OpenAlex

OpenAlex is increasingly used by universities, libraries, funding agencies, ranking sites and AI tools that analyze research. Like GoogleScholar, it is important to keep it up to date, moreover it provides a better extractions of datas (bibtex, endnotes, ...)

- Members should claim [their profile](#) for:
 - Remove incorrect references and affiliations;
 - Obtain more reliable indicators
 - Improve their visibility;
 - Better represent their institution and GERAD.

FRQ Recommendation to Funded Organizations and Their Members

All FRQ grants awarded since 2019 now have a DOI.

Objectives:

- funding traceability;
- link between funding and research outputs;
- simpler citation practices;
- recognition of FRQ's role.

Why use it?

- Uniquely identifies GERAD funding.
- Facilitates identification of publications associated with our group.

How to include it in an article:

- This research was funded by the Fonds de recherche du Québec (FRQ). Grant URL: <https://doi.org/10.69777/309029>.

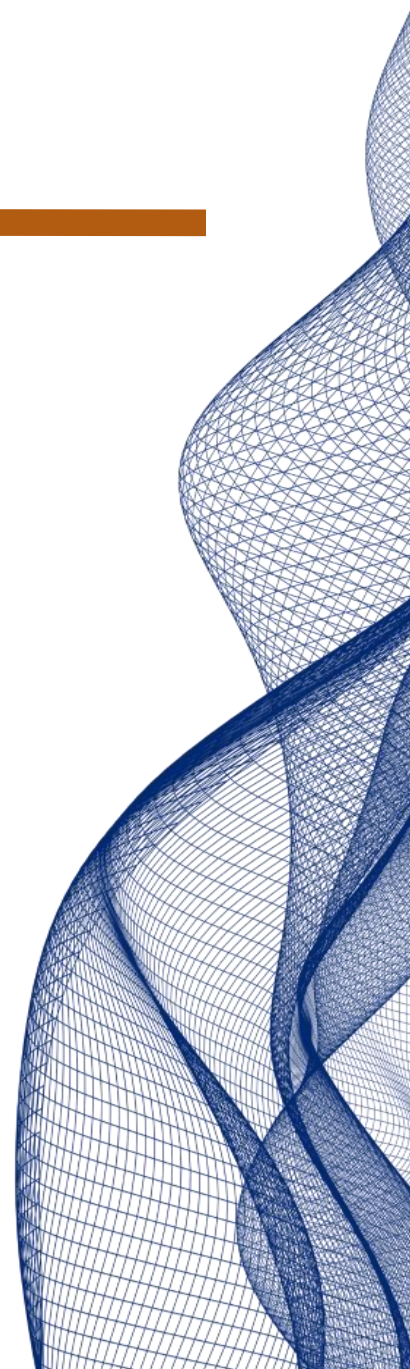
Our GERAD DOI (cont')

Use when:

- work was conducted within GERAD activities;
- an author is a GERAD member;
- the project benefited from GERAD infrastructure, personnel, scientific environment, or support.

Not necessary when:

- GERAD played no role;
- no author is affiliated with GERAD;
- the work was carried out entirely under another funding framework.

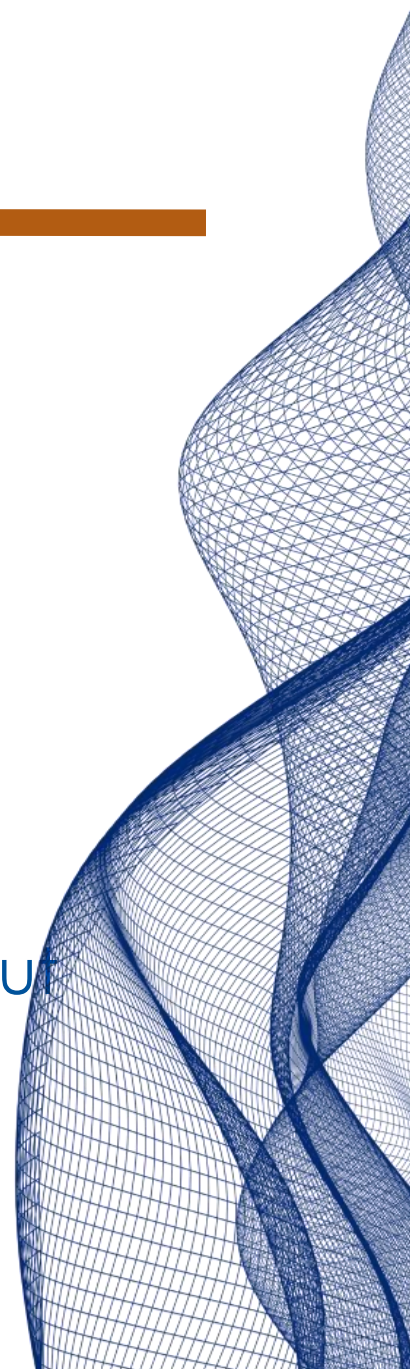


Our GERAD DOI (cont')

A strategic cluster such as GERAD receives funding to support:

- scientific activities;
- infrastructure;
- support staff;
- students;
- events;
- research facilitation.

Therefore, articles may result from GERAD resources even without direct funding to the researcher.



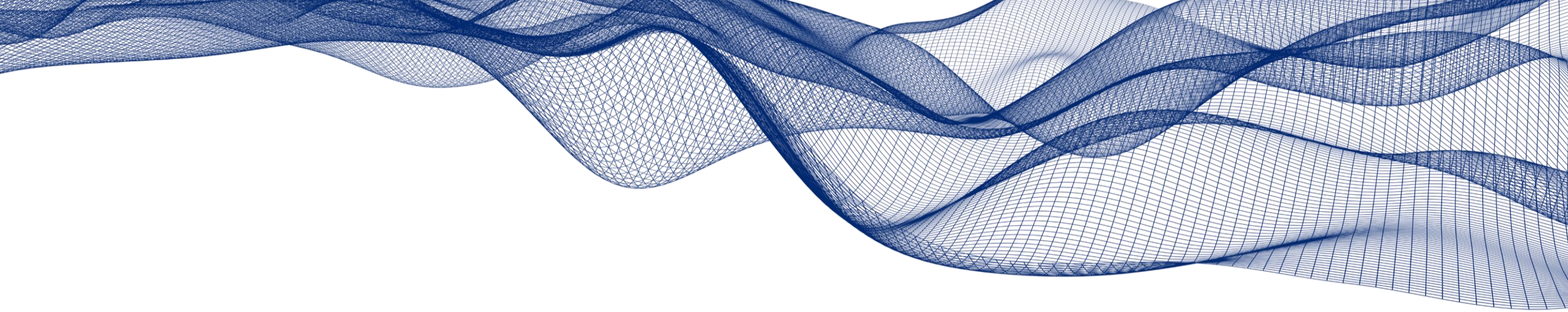


GERAD Recommendation to Its Members

GERAD recommends mentioning DOI <https://doi.org/10.69777/309029> in members' publications, even when no direct individual funding was received, especially if the article aligns with GERAD research axis, because the FRQ wants to grow its « branding » ... And it could influence our funding!

GERAD also encourages depositing your preprints and published articles in institutional repositories so they can be openly accessible immediately... whether or not you pay the journal's fees to make them available in open source.
